FROM THE BOARD CHAIR

Over the past few years, PCF's local impact has continued to grow. 2017 was no exception. This growth was fueled by generous Friends & Fellows donations, an expanding number of Endowment Builders, the establishment of new funds with a local focus, and donors who choose to use PCF as a vehicle for their own philanthropy through donor advised and family foundation funds. The result has been an increase in our grant dollars.

In addition to direct support through grants, PCF has also expanded the way in which we serve the local nonprofit community:

- PCF produced five-minute short films for nine local nonprofits in conjunction with Alibaba Pictures through our Big Heart Small Film project.
- PCF and the Ann Peppers Foundation co-sponsored a Storytelling Workshop for more than 50 nonprofits.
- PCF offers charitable gift annuities: We "lend" our CGA license to area nonprofits so they may offer this program to their donors.
- PCF manages an Agency Endowment program for 20 local organizations; they co-invest their assets with PCF's portfolio which returned 20.4% in 2017.

The Scoble Family Endowment is an Endowment Builder fund that supports PCF's local grant making in the area of Education. In 2018, the Scoble endowment helped to fund the grant to Partnership for Success!

Artist and craftsman John Schug moved to the Linda Vista area of Pasadena in 1985 when he began a relationship with Rick Nordin. In 2015, after being together 30 years, they divorced, and John relocated to

Altadena while Rick moved to DTLA. John loved what the Pasadena community offered. It was this community feeling that brought him to PCF in 2017 seeking advice on funding a life income gift. He and Rick had reemerged as friends after their breakup and were working on the best way to handle a piece of property they owned. PCF was the logical recipient.

A charitable remainder unitrust (CRUT) was a great way to avoid the taxes of an outright sale and generate a lifetime income for both. They also liked that the gift would

eventually fund an unrestricted endowment. The fact that each would benefit from a tax deduction was just icing on this charitable cake.




Rick Nordin established the John Schug Memorial Endowment to pay tribute to John's life and his love of Pasadena/Altadena.

The gift planning process had some interesting turns. During the appraisal, the agent discovered that the rural property John and Rick were going to transfer to the CRUT had tenants that were growing marijuana on the land. Removal of the plants was both a serious issue to make the gift happen and a lighthearted moment for some PCF board members who liked to inquire how the

"pot farm gift" was progressing. Sadly, the gift wasn't completed because John died on the very day he was to sign the trust document.

As John's heir and executor, Rick had to tell Jennifer DeVoll that the gift didn't make sense with John's death as it could be inherited free of any capital gains tax. However, Rick offered to make a gift in John's memory and commit to including the Foundation in his own estate plan. He set up an unrestricted endowment, the John Schug Memorial Endowment, to support PCF's local grant making, thus keeping John's love of Pasadena going in perpetuity. Rick may live in downtown LA but after 32 years in Pasadena it holds a special place in his heart, too. Rick's future gift through his estate makes him a current member of PCF's Legacy Society.

When Casey was a toddler, he had challenges dealing with other children as well as adults. He was diagnosed with autism at age 2, and his mother, Kelly began trying various therapies, with little success. Four years ago, she found Professional Child Development Associates (PCDA) and has been taking Casey there several times a week ever since. "Casey was a kid who could not relate to others," said Kelly. "Now he's 15, and I've seen him blossom since coming to PCDA. He has an amazing ear for music and can play melodies by ear in several different keys. He has gained confidence and is so happy. PCDA has been our saving grace."

Casey and his therapist Alaina have worked together, focusing on music and improving his language and social skills. Casey could not wait to talk about his experience at PCDA, "I love music, and my teacher Aliana is so nice, and I like to play with all the kids here."

PCDA serves over 1,000 children each year with autism and other developmental challenges. There are 80 people on staff and the team creates a tailored approach for each child's unique needs, mostly through one-on-one therapy. PCDA also works to create partnerships with parents to support the overall success of the family.

The Pasadena Community Foundation has long been a supporter of PCDA because of the important work the organization does for the community. PCDA recently set up an endowment with the Pasadena Community Foundation. "We want to ensure the great work being done at PCDA continues for many years to come," said Dr. Diane Cullinane, co-founder and Executive Director. "PCF understands our needs, and I am confident our endowment will be well managed."



MARJORY & HAROLD REICHERT ENDOWMENT BE 1 FOR HEALTH

As children of the Depression era, Marjory and Harold Reichert used their talents to give back to the communities in which they resided. Living humbly in Pennsylvania, Margie and Harold were known as the neighborhood cook and handyman, respectively. Whenever a family needed a home-cooked meal, Margie was there. Harold, a WWII pilot, was a metallurgist and lent a helping hand to others with their home needs. Their daughter Carole Jones, and her husband David, remember them fondly, as Carole explains, "They made a huge difference in our adult lives."

When Margie neared the last period of her life, she moved to the Pasadena-area to live with Carole

and David. Both Carole's father and mother had been so frugal throughout their lives that after their passing, there was a tidy sum of money left. The question was, where would they have wanted that money to go? "We put some money aside for the grandchildren's college funds. And, even with that, there was a nice amount left to do something special," explained Carole. "My mother liked the idea of David being involved and active in the Pasadena community. What if we chose to create a fund that included their name – to honor their generosity throughout their lives."

David explains, "At the time, while we were deciding where to put the funds, we saw that Pasadena Community Foundation was putting together their 'Be 1 in 100' campaign that invited individuals to build endowments with the organization. We thought it was a wonderful idea. It was settled. We built our fund with PCF."

The Marjory E. & Harold B. Reichert Endowment for Health focuses on organizations in the health care space. This fund's focus stemmed from Margie's last period of her life. While she lived with Carole and

David, she used health care services daily. For example, they received equipment from the Convalescent Aid Society to help support Margie's end of life care.

"I think my mother and father would be very proud of where this money is going," says Carole. David chimes in: "This is their legacy."
